Topic

Our topic this term will be London and we will be exploring our capital city with the help of the book The Queen's Hat. During the week beginning the 27th January we shall leave London for a week as we will be finding out all about The Chinese New Year, which this year is the Year of the Rat! Read on to see what we have planned at school up until February 14th!!

Our 7 Areas of Learning

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We are going to be focussing on understanding and expressing how we are feeling. We shall explore a range of feelings, what things can make us feel a certain way and how we can recognise how others are feeling.

We are going to develop our communication and language skills through regular Circle Times. Watch out for mystery objects that might spark conversations as well as the occasional Discovery Bottle! And what might have left those footneints? footprints??

<u>hysical Developme</u>nt

This half term we are going to focus on some simple gymnastics in our PE lessons. We will also have the opportunity to develop our gross motor skills in the outdoor environment. We are also looking to enhance our fine motor skills and our ability to use small tool with increasing effectiveness. And during Chinese New Year week we will be trying our hand at some Dragon dancing!

Our main story this half term will be The Queen's Hat. This will lead us into a number of literacy opportunities. Story maps, speech bubbles, lost hat posters, writing about London landmarks, freeze frames and writing tea party invitations are all going to be happening. Daily phonics will also continue for all children.

Our mathematics this half term is very much based around number. We will be looking at addition and subtraction and number bonds up to 10. We will explore place value and introduce the class to the part-whole model!

The nature of our topic lends itself to geography so we will be finding out about the landmarks of London. We will contrast London with our own environment and compare St.Paul's Cathedral to our local church. This will include a visit to our church. We will look at maps and use ICT to support us in finding out about the capital. We will also find out a little bit about The Queen herself. Whilst learning about The Chinese New Year we will also be looking at a different culture.

We are going to start the half term with some wintry landscapes to focus us in on the signs of Winter.

Other Information

Reading

The class teacher will endeavour to hear all children read on a one to one basis at least once a week. To help this to happen each child will be given a specific reading day. You will be informed of this day during the first week. Please ensure your child has their reading books on this day. Your child may read with other staff members or volunteers on different days so it is a good idea to always send their books with them.

Class Behaviour System

Our weather chart promotes positive work/behaviour and allows children to see the consequences of their actions. All children begin on the Sunshine every morning (pictures of their faces) and either move up for positive work/behaviour (onto the Rainbow and then Pot of Gold) or move down if they haven't followed the rules (Cloudy, Rainy and then Thunder and Lightning). Children will always be encouraged throughout the day to move themselves back up for positive work/behaviour.

Whole-School Reward Systems

'Ted' points are awarded daily to children in school for positive work/behaviour. Each time they reach 20 ted points, they receive a certificate in the Friday assembly (you will be notified about this and invited to attend in advance). The certificates include; Bronze 1, Bronze 2, Bronze 3, Silver 1, Silver 2, Silver 3 and then Gold, Children are also awarded with special teacher certificates for exceptional work/behaviour.
