We would love to see pictures of your activities.


Use your SeeSaw home learning code to upload these onto Seesaw.

Most of all we want you to have fun learning!



An Easter Marathon


Our challenge to you and your family is this:

Can you walk, run or jog a marathon over the days of the holidays?


We have seen lots of you outside passing school doing your daily exercise.
